

## AUT Voting (and Housing) Survey, 2016: Areas report

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This report is based on an on-line sample of Auckland adults, carried out by UMR in early September 2016. The data are weighted (gender, age, ethnicity, 2015 national voting) and with missing values have been excluded.

With a sample size of 1000 the 2016 survey can reliably be broken down to capture differences in viewpoints amongst the different sub-regional components of Auckland. There are two main ways in which subcomponents might be identified:

- The North, West (Waitakeres), Central and South (Manukau) ‘zones’ (e.g. as recognised by Statistics NZ)
- Type of settlement/area: e.g. rural, inner city etc.

This report uses the earlier framework, although with the south being broken out unto the east and the south (proper) since these two areas differ considerably in terms of socio-economic status (and ethnicity).

The following table reports means of 10-point scales (as do several later tables).

- Interest in local politics is reportedly higher in Central and East areas;
- Rating of Auckland as place to live: Central, East and North have the highest scores;
- View of Auckland plan is highest in Central and South;
- Confidence in Council is highest In the South and Central.

In terms of relevance of issues when voting:

- Roading congestion is most relevant in the East;
- Public transport in the West;
- The Auckland economu in Central and East;
- Rates in East;
- Housing in East and South;
- Crime/safety in South;
- Social Issues in West.
- Other issues evenly distributed.

Interest in local elections had changed most in North.  
 Central residents shows highest interest level (with East, West and South not disillusioned);  
 Views on number of Local boards was similar;  
 South residents were more likely to see population increase as too great;  
 North residents & East were more likely to see conditions as having worsened.  
 Voting likelihoods and current choice situation was similar across areas;  
 Goff is most strongly in the South and West;  
 Crone is most strongly supported in North and East;  
 Labour candidates are more strongly supported in South;  
 Support for specific Maori seats is strongest in the South, with support for the Board more widespread.  
 National party votes are more likely located in the North/Central East areas.  
 2013 Local election voting is similarly distributed;

2013 Support for Len Brown was highest in the South.

North residents were more likely to have heard of the plan, with limited awareness in the South.
